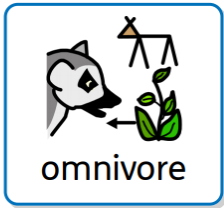
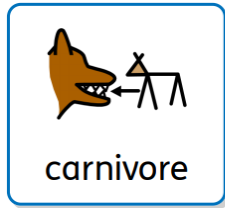


Animals are living things.

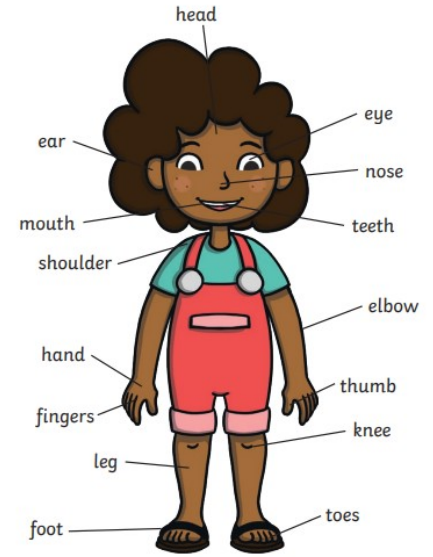
