The weather starts to get cooler. The days start to get shorter.

Many types of leaves begin to turn brown and fall from trees.



winter



December, January, February

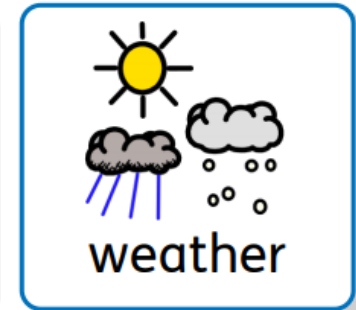
The coldest time of year. The days are short and the nights are longer.

Many trees have no leaves. Some animals hibernate in this time.

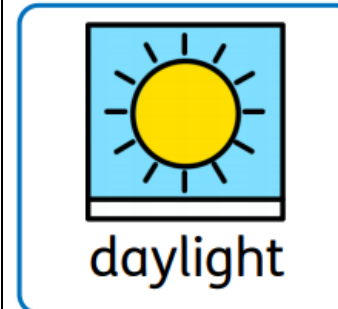
