The best way of describing the event is a rave with thousands of children, each with a torch to wave in the air as they jump around singing having a whale of a time. Well done to all the children and staff who were involved with the event.

Our Year 3 and 4 Choir has been hard at work learning songs from the different genres we have been learning about as part of our music curriculum. We are preparing for a Celebration of Music at Fishponds Concert on Monday 25th March 2024. This concert will involve performances from both the Year 3 and 4 Choir as well as the Young Voices Choir and some special performances from our music students. Everyone is welcome so please come along.

You can still sign up for individual music lessons. These individual music lessons are taught by teachers from Bristol Beacon. The instruments you can learn are: guitar, piano, voice, ukulele and recorder. We have a piano, ukuleles and recorders which can be used for these lessons on site. If you wish to learn the guitar, you will need to provide that yourself. Bristol Beacon deals with the finances directly. They offer bursaries so if you are Pupil Premium, a child in care, have an EHCP or are a refugee you may be eligible for free or discounted musical experiences.

Reception, Year 1, 2 and 3 all really enjoyed Enterprise Day and Maths day this term. We all applied lots of skills including Maths, oracy and our learning to learn animals too!

Some of our Year 6 girls have been very enterprising and have been selling stationary and 'lucky-dip' bags to raise money to improve our school playground. We're really proud of their initiative and passion, especially for something that will come to fruition when they're in secondary school!



Year 4

This term in year 4, the children have been learning all about Angry Earth. The children have found out why and how volcanos erupt, why earthquakes occur and the impact that Angry Earth has on us and the planet. In Firefish, they even practiced an earthquake drill!! In science, we have been looking at our digestive system and the function of our teeth. The children loved (but were also disgusted!) by the digestive system demonstration - we started by mashing the bread with water, put it down a pipe, into a hot bag water, through the wiggly balloon and then out of the balloon and into the tray.

In English, the children wrote their own descriptive stories, inspired by 'The Secret of Black Rock' and also created a non-chronological report on their very own Flanimal which they made out of clay! We have filled our classrooms with the joyous sound of glockenspiels, continued our fabulous karate skills with Sensei David and successfully completed a human pyramid in gymnastics! Well done Year 4 for all your hard work, keep it up!

In science Year 6 worked on the classification of plants. They also explored the school grounds for moss and liverworts. If you are out about on the weekend see if you can find any!

Year 6 PE this term has focused on running. We have been impressed with how our fitness has improved!


World Book Day


School Council

Playground Revamp

We are so incredibly excited to be able to show you the final design chosen for the grassy space at the top of the Key Stage 2 playground!



After working with some Year 6 pupils and in discussions with Mr. Densley, we have selected the best value for money design and hope to have it built over the summer holidays ready for September. It is a BIG ask as there is a lot of money needed for the project but, luckily, FOFA have agreed to help fundraise for the project.

Until we've reached our target all school fundraising will be in aid of our new playground. Home-based Reading

Are you aware of the multitude of benefits associated with children engaging in home-based reading? Recent research suggests that this practice extends beyond growing academic test scores: it significantly enriches their educational journey. Notably, it develops a child's level of vocabulary, problem-solving capabilities and general knowledge. Additionally, there is compelling evidence to show that reading at home profoundly contributes to child's personal development, social emotional mental health and understanding of social consequences.

Devoting 20 minutes each day to reading can show substantial improvements in your child's progress, academic attainment and holistic development.

Should you need assistance in selecting suitable texts or support with phonics, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher, Mr. Jones (our English Leader), or Miss Burgess (our Phonics Leader).



The Reef

This term The Reef have been learning about Space! They have enjoyed using the stomp rocket to support our science lessons. They have also made lots of space-themed art and listening to songs about planets.



Modern Foreign Languages

In Spanish: this term Y2 & Y3 have been learning all about the four seasons! "En invierno hace frío y nieva", "En primavera las flores crecen y los pájaros cantan", "En verano hace sol y hace calor", Een otoño los árboles pierden sus hojas".



Years 4, 5 & 6 have been learning all about telling the date in Spanish - ¿Qué fecha es hoy? – including the days of the week, the months, seasons and reviewing our number from 1 to 31. We also learned to ask when your birthday is and answer the question. – Ask the children to tell you today's date!

The children have loved taking it in turns to take Everywhere Bear home and we loved hearing all about the adventures they have been on with him.
